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

Bio-Profile of Rep. Jun Alcover

Former Maoist leader turned fearless pro-democracy defender

BORN OF HUMBLE beginnings, Jun Alcover never forgets his past but never allows his past to dominate his actions as he steadfastly remains as a beacon of hope, light amidst the darkness of despair, and a voice for the many victims of the atrocities deliberately carried out by the Maoist Communist Party of the Philippines-New People’s Army-National Democratic Front (CPP-NA-NDF) as well as the many thousands who are still under threat of this menace.

Sired to a soldier-father, Pastor Abarquez-Alcover Sr. of Carcar, Province of Cebu; and Jesusa Moraten-Montero of Maasin, Iloilo, on October 5, 1952 in C.

Padilla St., Cebu City. Pastor M. Alcover, Jr., Jun as he is intimately called, saw the light of day in Cebu City but practically grew-up in the different areas of Mindanao, like Jolo, Sulu, and Lanao del Norte, where his father was assigned. Jun finished his elementary studies in Iligan City graduating as class salutatorian. Back to Cebu for his secondary schooling, he enrolled at the Abellana National School (ANS). Early on, he showed his mettle in leadership by getting elected president of the ANS Supreme Student Council. His leadership ability caught the eyes of militant Manila-based leaders so that they recruited and made him join later to become a ranking leader of the Kabataang Makabayan

bloody and violent student demonstrations against the school that resulted to his expulsion. Later in 1970, he organized the Union of Democratic Workers – the first CPP labor front in the Province of Cebu that sparked the Maoist communist infiltration of labor groups there, particularly Atlas Consolidated Mining and Development Corporation in Toledo City. Also, during the same period, Jun was sent by the Eastern Visayas Regional Party Committee to train in explosives, ordnance, and propaganda inside the so-called UP commune. Indeed, Jun was not only a part but a pillar of the so-called First Quarter Storm activism and militancy.

In 1971, he became an original member of the CPP-NPA expansion team for the Visayas and Mindanao regions. When Martial Law was declared, he went underground and later on married Aner Bontilao-Arnoco, also an NPA amazon, in a communist wedding ceremony. After the wedding, he organized the first NPA squad in the mountains within

(KM) and the Samahang Demokratikong Kabataan (SDK) in the ‘70’s. A few months later, he led the first and historic militant student street demonstration in Cebu City against the administration of Abellana National School, a product of Maoist communist retooling and manipulation. Notably, this demonstration sparked the widespread several violent and bloody school demonstrations in Cebu City.

He was conditionally enrolled at the University of San Carlos (USC) taking up Political Science as his major subject. While enrolled there, Jun initiated and led several


We are a witness to the more than 20 years of negotiations for peace that somehow has not and will never

unnoticed so that in 1973 his status was elevated to a ranking party member of the Eastern Visayas Regional Communist Party Committee. Thus, he became Commander-Political Officer (CO-PO), NPA Regional Armed Unit in Samar Island in 1974.

After long years of evading military forces, he was captured in 1978 and placed in solitary confinement for more than six months. His confinement offered him some opportunities to examine his conscience and directions in life.

Immediately, after being granted amnesty and released from detention, he became a strong and committed anti-communist/pro-democracy advocate. At first, he became an ALU-TUCP labor organizer, in Cebu. *Catharsis*, the first anti-communism radio program aired over DYLA in Cebu City was launched. Then organized the Katipunan Para sa Demokratikong Reporma (KADRE), a popular anti-communism group in the Visayas and Mindanao in 1980.

Cong. Maglunsod hit for “unparliamentary conduct”

THE ALLIANCE OF NATIONALISM AND DEMOCRACY (ANAD) strongly supports the order issued by Secretary-General Marilyn Yap for Anak Pawis Partylist Representative Joel Maglunsod to vacate his “office tent”, along with Maoist communist front sectoral organizations that set up camp at the gates of the Batasan Pambansa. However, “the order should immediately be implemented and not wait until June 6,” said Cong. Jun Alcover, of ANAD Partylist

“These people had been given more than enough time and space and their continued stay in that area has shown their disregard and utter disrespect to the House of Representatives,” said Alcover. “They blatantly abused our country’s democratic space,” said Alcover.

More than 10 “tents” and illegal temporary structures with matching red banners of Maoist communist front sectoral organizations were established in that area and obviously intended for a long stay. Aside from the “Batasan Siege”, Maoist communist sectoral front organizations had pitched camp, for years already, in front of the main offices of the Department of Agrarian Reform (DAR), Elliptical Road, Quezon City.

ANAD maintains that protests and other forms of peaceful assemblies at the gates of

the Batasan Pambansa and other government offices is welcome, “pitching camp and putting illegal structures there tantamount to hooliganism as if they are pressuring Congress and government to succumb to their demands,” Alcover stressed.

Alcover lamented Maglunsod’s attitude as a member of Congress. “What happened to him? He has brazenly expressed disrespect to an institution that he also belongs. His actuations, that placed the entire House of Representatives’ integrity to question and public ridicule, is something that must be investigated by the Ethics Committee of the Lower House and appropriate disciplinary sanctions be meted against him,” Alcover pointed out.

On the other hand, Cong. Alcover explained that if Congress refuses to investigate Cong. Maglunsod and immediately remove the illegal structures at the gates of the Batasan, “ANAD would take this as an expression of tolerance on the part of the House’s leadership. The news item that came out might only be intended for public relations purposes.”

In so doing, Alcover said that organized pro-democracy forces in the country, particularly in Metro Manila, can do the same, “in pursuit of our pro-democratic crusade. Congress cannot prevent us from doing so,” he added. ☐

Psuedo-partylist Reps slammed

IT WAS the so-called first strike but it hit the nail on its head, so to speak. Some thought it would only be the one but it turned to be 3 strikes, in all.

It was the Alliance for Nationalism and Democracy’s (ANAD) stunning rebuke of the oftenly used propaganda milieu by the Maoist communist pseudo partylist organizations in Congress.

ANAD Rep. Jun Alcover called on the Maoist partylist personalities to “stop using the House of Representatives as a venue to launch their anti-government tirades.” This came about when Bayan Muna Rep. Satur Ocampo, in a startling speech, denounced government’s action putting him and some other so-called militant/progressives (sic!) in the military and police’s Order of Battle; and that they were branded as communist-terrorist.

In reaction, Rep. Alcover pointed out that government is not responsible in labeling them as communist-terrorist. “It was your idol, Maoist messiah, and Maoist communist CPP founding chair Jose Ma. Sison who admitted, in his speech in Brussels, Belgium, March 4, 1987, that Bayan Muna, Gabriela, and other sectoral front and partylist organizations are under the National Democratic Front, the political arm of the Communist Party of the Philippines, to wage a continuing political struggle against the government,” Alcover stressed.


He chided Ocampo for continuously blaming the government for its woes, “when in truth and in fact, they are the ones responsible for the current state of economic and political conditions of the country,” he clarified. “If indeed you are not a communist, as what you claim to be, I challenge you and your colleagues to openly denounce and condemn the atrocities committed by the Maoist communist-terrorist New Peoples Army against the peace loving and innocent Filipinos,” Alcover demanded.

His challenge seemed to have fallen on deaf ears as Ocampo and other pseudo-partylist members chose to remain silent, mum, and did nothing.

Rep. Alcover lambasted the pseudo partylist groups in Congress for using Congress to wage a vicious black propaganda campaign against government, its institutions and its officials. “It is high time that the true and real intentions if these people must be revealed. We must unmask them so that the Filipino people shall know and be given a better understanding as to who these people are so that they could intelligently make a decision as to the course to take towards their future,” Alcover said. ☐

Charter Change must not be personality centered

EFFORTS to amend our constitution must not be personality based but should consider what is best for our country and people. This was expressed by Cong. Pastor Alcover Jr., ANAD Partylist Representative as he explained that ANAD will support moves to amend the Constitution, either thru Constituent Assembly or Constitutional Convention.

"We cannot be silent on the matter considering the fact that our people need adequate support from government which our present constitution could not extend to them with dispatch. Amending some provisions of the constitution could spell enhancement and support for this," he said.

He cited some provision that could bolster our economy and cause political maturity among our people. "Either towards parliamentary, federal, or putting up a stronger and improved presidential form of governance does not worry us. But ANAD's utmost priority is one that would enhance our people's capability towards economic development through opportunities that would address poverty and capability building," Alcover pointed out.

On the issue that additional partylist representations were named to the Lower House to ensure Charter Change (Cha-Cha), Alcover said that the highest court of the land has mandated it to be so. "It is in compliance to the mandates of our constitution. The apportioning of 20% of the total members of Congress for partylist representation was in the Constitution long before the move/s to amend the constitution came out," he added.

Alcover urged all sectors to view such moves in the context of promoting the general welfare and capability of our people; and not against any individual. "The latter would clearly be of great disservice to our people and country because personal and biased intentions would be the order of the day, so to speak, and not the giving of importance to the future and well-being of our people and country," Alcover stressed. ☐

Maoist Pseudo partylist must bare out!

The ALLIANCE FOR NATIONALISM AND DEMOCRACY (ANAD) strongly condemn, in unequivocal terms, the unabated rash of kidnappings, murders, and attacks by the Maoist communist New Peoples Army (NPA) as it calls on the Representatives of the self-styled pseudo Partylist groups, in Congress, to come out from their intentional hibernation and denounce the atrocities of the NPA.

ANAD Partylist Representative Jun Alcover decried the Maoist NPA utter disregard for peace and human rights which is in direct contravention to their acronym being the so-called “protectors of the people.”

“What have they done to the 3 soldiers of the 11th Infantry Battalion, Philippine Army in Guihulngan City, Negros Occidental and a certain Staff Sergeant Manlangit of the 36th IB, PA, in Agusan del Sur? They mercilessly killed them in cold blood?” Alcover said. “Do not these soldiers deserve the same human rights protection from terrorist actions?” Alcover asked.

“Why did they (NPA) raided the DPWH office in Barangay Bacacay, Gubat, Sorsogon last May 25? Isn’t it because they are wholly opposed to the construction and infrastructure projects of the government?” Alcover quipped.

Alcover explained, “What is happening now is obviously the implementation of Mao Ze Dong’s doctrine of – OPPOSE WHAT THE GOVERNMENT SUPPORTS; AND SUPPORT WHAT THE GOVERNMENT OPPOSES!”

Alcover lamented the fact that the continuing terrorism committed by the Maoist NPA has been met with a loud and deafening silence by pseudo-Partylist lawmakers of this 14th Congress.
